## General Data Protection Regulation (GDPR)

From the 25<sup>th</sup> May 2018, new regulations will be introduced which affects how all organisations, including schools, handle people's data. This is called the General Data Protection Regulation. Compliance with the regulations will be an ongoing process and EWPS has appointed a data protection officer to advise and manage compliance with the regulation. Their details are:

**Year 2** SATs occur throughout the week beginning the 14<sup>th</sup> and 21<sup>st</sup> May. These are generally done in small groups throughout the two weeks and do not therefore follow a specific timetable.



## Operation Encompass

Ellen Wilkinson Primary School has been given the opportunity to take part in a project that will run jointly between schools and Newham Borough Metropolitan Police.



Operation Encompass is the reporting to schools before 10am on a school day when a child or young person has been involved or exposed to a domestic abuse incident the previous evening.

Operation Encompass will ensure that a member of the school staff, known as a Designated Safeguarding Lead, is trained to allow them to liaise with the police and to use the information that has been shared, in confidence, while ensuring that the school is able to make provision for possible difficulties experienced by children, or their families, who have been involved in, or exposed to, a domestic abuse incident.

We are keen to offer the best help and support possible to all our pupils and we believe this will be extremely beneficial in effectively meeting the needs of the children and families involved.

The police were immediately contacted and advised us that there was no risk to the school. We therefore took this opportunity to hold a practise emergency evacuation drill prior to registration.
