Safeguarding Policy Update

At the last Governing Body meeting the Child Protection and Safeguarding Policy was updated in line with changes in Keeping Children Safe in Education (2020). A copy of the policy and the COVID addendum have been attached to this newsletter

We take the commitment to protect and safeguard our children very seriously which is why we wanted to draw your attention particularly to <u>section 4.</u> This explains about the four main types of abuse referred to in Keeping Children Safe in Education (Physical, Emotional, Sexual and Neglect).

Within those four main types of abuse there are specific types of abuse that our school is alert to including peer on peer abuse, child sexual exploitation, criminal exploitation including county lines and honour based violence (including female genital mutilation and breast ironing). Please take time to look at this information and contact us if you would like to discuss anything further.

Remember..

If you are worried that a child you know is at risk of serious harm through abuse or neglect, you should tell us or contact Newham MASH on 020 3373 4600

However, if you think a child is in immediate danger, phone the police immediately on 999
