Reading/ Phonics	Read the ROCKET poem on page 4. Listen out for the 'r' sound. Say a few words that had the 'r' sound in them. Practise writing the grapheme: r. Now segment and blend a few words: rat, ring, run, tree. Draw a picture of a rocket and label it.	Read the HOT poem on page 4. Listen out for the 'h' sound. Say a few words that had the 'h' sound in them. Practise writing the grapheme: h. Now segment and blend a few words: hang, hot, hop, hush. Draw a picture of a big, fat hen. Now label it.	Read the HORN poem on page 5. Listen out for the 'or' sound. Say a few words that had the 'or' sound in them. Practise writing the grapheme: or. It's made of two letters but we only hear one sound. Now segment and blend a few words: horn, port, short, torch. Draw a picture of a turtle and label it.	Read the FIRE poem on page 5. Listen out for the 'f' sound. Say a few words that had the 'f' sound in them. Practise writing the grapheme: f. Now segment and blend a few words: fish, fog, for, fang. Draw a picture of a fire engine and label it.	Practise all the sounds learnt this week. Write the letters, write short words and try to read them. Parents/carers: you can say a word and ask children to fill in with the missing sounds. You can use cards with the sounds learnt so far, including the previous weeks.
English	Make a shopping list When you go to the shops you can be really helpful by making a list so you don't forget to buy things. You can also do this if you have received a delivery. Ask for help using your sounds, you could also add some drawings to your list.	Retell a traditional tale acting it out using toys. For example, The three little pigs with Lego, Goldilocks and the Three Bears with soft toys. Make a poster or sell tickets to come and watch. Film it on a device and share with school after.	Writing with carrots Explore mark making using a carrot, choose your favourite coloured paint and express your creativity giving meaning to your design and please share your lovely pictures with us.	Make homemade musical instruments with recycled household items. Sing nursery rhymes e.g. Incy Wincy Spider, Humpty Dumpty, using your instruments and then make up your own song.	Choose a book your child enjoyed reading this week. Build scenes of the book building bricks, natural objects found in the garden or in the park, small world toys or even create your own props. Encourage your child to "tell" the story in their own words as they build the scenes.
