Reading/ Phonics	Read EAR poem on page 4. Listen out for the 'ear' sound. Say a few words that had the 'ear' sound in them. Practise writing the grapheme: ear. Now segment and blend a few words: near, clear, fear, beard, Draw a picture and label it.	Read the JELLYFISH poem on page 4. Listen out for the 'j' sound. Say a few words that had the 'j' sound in them. Practise writing the grapheme: j. Now segment and blend a few words: jet, jog, josh, jam, Draw a picture of Jellyfish. Now label it.	Read the OWL poem on page 5. Listen out for the 'ou' sound. Say a few words that had the 'ou' sound in them. Practise writing the grapheme: ou. Now segment and blend a few words: loud, south, pouch, shout. Draw a picture of an owl. Now label it.	Read the URCHIN poem on page 5. Listen out for the 'ur' sound. Say a few words that had the 'ur' sound in them. Practise writing the grapheme: ur. Now segment and blend a few words: hurt, burn, curl, fur. Draw a picture of an urchin and label it.	Practise all the sounds learnt this week. Write the letters, write short words and try to read them. Parents/carers: you can say a word and ask children to fill in with the missing sounds. You can use cards with the sounds learnt so far, including the previous weeks.
English	Watch 'Stomp, dinosaur, stomp' (https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=ADqdWSJ6Dt0). Listen to the words carefully. Can you hear any words that sound the same? We call these rhyming words. Use the balance scales to check the children's estimations. The children could also hold buckets or bags in each hand and place items inside to feel which has the stronger downward pull. 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	Use popular counting back songs such as 5 Little Monkeys Jumping on the Bed. Encourage children to take on the role of the 5 monkeys. Represent each verse with counters on a 5 frame, displaying the numerals alongside. Ask them to predict how many monkeys will be left as each one falls off the bed. What about the last monkey? How could we show this on our 5 frame? Which numeral should we use?	Encourage the children to represent numbers including 0 Show me 3 fingers, show me 5, show me 0 Show me 4 apples in the basket, show me 2, show me 0 Show me 4 claps, 1 clap, 0 claps. Evidence Me	Have a bag containing numerals from 0 to 5. As you pull out a numeral combine it with a task for the children to do. For example, if you pull out a 2, the children could take 2 giant strides or 2 tiptoes, do 2 jumps, run to the hoop and back twice, find 2 pebbles and bring them back etc. Evidence Me
