## Settled Status - Stay Settled in Newham

Did you know that each child must have their own EU Settled Status (EUSS) application? You can apply for your child or they can apply for themselves. If your child was born in the UK but is not a British citizen, they will still need to apply. You need to apply before the 30th of June.

If you have already applied to the EUSS, you can link your child's application to yours. This means that if your own application is successful, your child will get the same status as you.

You will need to prove your relationship to your child and have a copy of their ID.

# **Learning Gallery**

Welcome to the Learning Gallery! Here are some of the activities and outcomes from Key Stage 2 during the last couple of weeks.

Year 3 children have been very busy. This week they have included some images from their science and geography learning as well as their ukulele lessons!



<u>Year 4</u> Seahorse Class were creating tally charts, bar charts and pictograms based on data of colours of Skittles in a packet. They then discussed how this information could be presented on an interactive display board and designed it accordingly. Octopus class were learning about electricity and exploring how they could create different circuits.



<u>Year 5 (& 6!)</u> enjoyed their first aid training. They learnt about how the heart and circulatory system worked, how to perform CPR, use a defibrillator, bandage wounds and even how to perform the Heimlich manoeuvre if someone is choking!



<u>Year 6</u> - Children in year 6 visited Fairplay House for the day last Friday. They were able to take part in high ropes, zip line and canoeing activities.
