Learning Tips



Reading

Don't forget to take part in the Summer Reading Challenge at Beckton Globe library. Simply read at least 6 books during the summer to get a certificate and medal!

Street Tag is a free child and family-friendly mobile application that uses virtual tags to incentivize communities and families to become more physically active and boost mental health.

We are delighted to announce that EWPS will be participating in the Street Tag NEWHAM Schools Leader board program.

With Street Tag, participants record the distance they walk, run, or cycle by collecting virtual tags with their smartphone at various locations, watching their total distance accumulate to climb up the Schools leader board; steps are converted into points by syncing their steps into the Street Tag app. This is designed to encourage families to walk and cycle to school, to be physically active, to connect with green spaces, and is an opportunity to rediscover their local area as well as earning rewards for their school.


