Governor's Update

Hello, and welcome to our first Governor's Update which we hope will become a regular feature following each Governing Body meeting.

As this was the first meeting of the year, we discussed the school priorities for this year which include:

- Developments in reading, writing and maths
- Continued refinement of our curriculum
- Wellbeing and mental health
- Introducing the new Early Years Framework

The agenda also included setting up committees for the year and deciding on which area of the curriculum each governor would have a particular responsibility for as Link Governor. These areas include: Inclusion, Safeguarding, Wellbeing, Training, English, Arts, Early Years and STEM (science, technology, maths).

We were delighted to hear from Ms Ferguson how well the children had settled in at the start of term and how much everyone appreciated the relaxation of COVID restrictions. We also discussed how the school supported Safeguarding, Equality and Diversity and Wellbeing for pupils, families, and staff.

Learning Tips



Reading Read aloud regularly

Read every day. It's a special time to snuggle up and enjoy a story. Stories matter and it's fun re-reading them and

poring over the pictures. Try adding funny voices to bring characters to life.

Maths

Learning the time can be tricky! Try to build in little challenges throughout the day. This could include:

- Calculate the time it takes to walk to school
- Work out how many minutes left until the next hour
- Ask them what time it is.





Well-being The five ways to wellbeing

We know parenting isn't always easy. Although it's often amazing and rewarding to watch your children grow up, and to help them learn to be independent, it can also be really hard work.
