When you look around, everything is made from shapes. So why not encourage your children to learn the names of shapes when you're out and about to entertain them? They could identify car wheels as circles, windows as rectangles and even tiles as hexagons or whatever shape they may be!

If your child is older, see if they can spot 10 right angles on their way to school.



Well-being The five ways to wellbeing
