Colder weather & ventilation



As the weather has turned colder please make sure your child comes to school with a coat to wear at breaks and layers that can be added or taken off during class times. The provision of adequate ventilation, which must include air flow, is part of the statutory guidance all schools currently have from the Department for Education and Public Health.

However, we also need to balance this with children not being too cold to learn! We do have our heating on full and have air quality monitors in all classes so that staff can keep doors and windows closed as much as possible. We air the classrooms fully before school and during breaks to reduce need for doors open during class times and we also have rearranged some rooms as much as possible to keep children away from draughts but making sure your child has their school jumper with them will help too. Thank you.

Flu Vaccination

After being asked by a parent, we have checked with the vaccination service and your child can have the flu vaccine if they have had Covid but are now recovered.

Learning Tips



Reading

Take breaks while reading

Your child doesn't have to read an entire book in one go! Any time spent sharing or talking about a book is beneficial, even if it's just a couple of minutes at a time. If they have to close the book early because it's time for tea, or they're just losing interest, that's okay!

Reading can take a lot of mental energy and taking breaks gives children a chance to slowly build the mental stamina they need, so that soon they will be able to read for longer stretches of time.

Maths

Welcome to the November Mathematics Numeracy Challenge!

The competition will run for one week, Monday to Sunday, 15 – 21 November. Each school will compete to earn as many Live Mathematics points as possible within the week. The top schools will be the schools with the highest average total of Live Mathematics points. This will be calculated by taking the total number of Live Mathematics points divided by the total number of registered students in the school.



So remember to keep those Mathematics challenges going!



Well-being

Maintaining good mental health is just as important as having a healthy body. It affects the way children think, feel and act. As a parent, you play an important role in promoting your child's mental health and recognising when there may be early signs of difficulties.

Tip 4 - Foster your child's self-esteem.

Self-esteem is how they feel about themselves, both inside and out. Children with good self-esteem generally have a positive outlook, accept themselves and feel confident. Fostering self-esteem includes showing love and acceptance, asking questions about their activities / interests and helping them to set realistic goals.

Engine Off - Every Stop



Did you know that 4,500 children are hospitalised and 96 people die each year due to poor air quality in Newham? Newham residents are exposed to high levels of toxic pollution from vehicles, contributing to the highest death rate in England according to the UK Health Security agency.

Therefore Newham council are supporting the London-wide anti-idling campaign 'Engine Off. Every Stop' this November. The campaign runs through November and **aims to improve air quality and reduce air pollution simply by asking London drivers to turn their engines off when stationary to stop the spread of this invisible killer.**
