Dear Parents & Carers,

Welcome to this week's newsletter.

New Covid guidance for schools

The Covid guidance for schools has been updated due to the government announcement in relation to the new omicron variant.

The main changes are:

- Mask wearing in communal areas and corridors for all adults unless exempt.
- Visitors (including parents) must wear masks when in the building unless exempt. (Mask wearing in the playground is a personal choice as it is outside)
- Returning from travelling to a red list country is a 10 day isolation on return regardless of PCR result
- Returning from abroad (non-red list) you need to isolate and do a PCR test by day 2 of return and keep isolating until a negative result.

<u>At the moment school visits and events can continue in accordance with the school's risk</u> <u>assessment and as long as the above is followed.</u> Therefore class assemblies, pupil discos and the 8 nativity performances will still go ahead as long as the following is followed:

- 1. No more than 2 people per pupil at any performance
- 2. All adults need to wear masks when inside the building attending performances unless exempt.

We would ask for your full support in this matter, as we believe it is really important children and their families have these experiences. However please be aware that even with this in place we may have to cancel if the school guidance changes again.

Location and access to the site

- Please note all children must be collected from school at 3.15 as usual. Children who are not collected will not be allowed to attend the event and ticket money will be refunded.

- Please collect your child promptly as we have only 15 minutes between the two events on each night and staff are giving up their own time so these events can take place.
- We strongly suggest that as your child enters the hall that you take their coat away with you and bring it back when you collect them (this way they don't get muddled with someone else's)
- Sorry no parents can attend the discos
- Discos are NO PHOTOGRAPHY events (this includes mobile phones).
- This is a non-uniform event.
