We therefore now have a parent governor vacancy. Paper copies of the governor application form will be sent home with your child later this week. So why not get involved and help shape the education our children experience!




We also spent some time completing a questionnaire for Newham on governing body effectiveness. This will also help us plan for any improvement needs identified.

Well-being - Check in with your friends



Sending memes, jokes and messages online is easy – but finding the right words to talk to a friend who's having a hard time can be tricky.
