

Our theme this year will be animals in Classic Literature, and we will be reading the timeless tales of Beatrix Potter and 'The Wind in the Willows' by Kenneth Grahame.







On Thursday 3rd of March, WBD will be celebrating 25 years, which is a testament to how much we all love reading. Reading



Set a good example; be caught in the act! Children are a product of their upbringing and mimic the behaviour they see at home, repeating the actions they observe from their parents or guardians. If a child observes

their parent/guardian reading every night, then that child will emulate the same

behaviour. So pick up a book, newspaper or magazine and get caught reading!

Well-being Playing outside

Research shows that children have a need to be outside, taking opportunities to explore, discover, climb and run.

We are really fortunate in our local area to have space to do this. Make sure you involve children in using your outdoor space by asking them to help create obstacle courses for one another, asking them to think about

what tools and resources they will need. Or you could provide materials for the children to make dens outdoors.
