Dear Parents & Carers,

This week I was privileged to receive a Martisor from one of our year 4 children. This is a special pin that many people from Moldova & Romania wear from the 1st until the 31st of March to celebrate the start of spring and the hope it brings. My gift giver then explained that once it has reached the 31st day "you have to hang the pin on a tree and make a wish as it could come true!"



I was truly touched by such a generous gesture and the hope it represented, however it threw into even sharper context the current devastation, destruction and loss of life being caused by the conflict in Ukraine. For those caught up in the violence and attacks, it's unimaginable – and for those looking on from afar, the feelings of fear and helplessness can be overwhelming, making it hard for us as adults to look towards hope. As a school we have families from both countries within our community and cannot begin to imagine the turmoil and pain they are experiencing, but please know that our thoughts are with you at this time.

This generation of children are more connected through news and social media than any others have been before. This means that many of them, even if not directly affected, will be acutely aware that on the other side of Europe a country full of children just like them are experiencing fear and trauma that no child should endure. We have built our school community upon shared values including respect and being heard and cared for, and aim for our children to be global citizens becoming the change they want to see in the world, but not a world like this.

Parents and carers are best placed to know how much or little their child is, or needs to be, aware of but these conversations are hard. To support this we have put some links in the learning tips this week about ideas you may wish to consider, please make sure you check these first to see if they are appropriate for your situation and the age of your child.

We have also been approached and are happy to support a humanitarian appeal in relation to items needed urgently by the huge numbers of people who have had to flee. Details of the items requested and how to do this are provided below.

It is always hard as a Headteacher to know when to speak up and when to remain silent, as for schools it is important that we remain neutral, however please know that I will continue to wear my Martisor for this month in the spirit it was given to me, but be assured that on the 31st it will be placed lovingly on a tree with my earnest wish for peace.

Please take care of each other.

Polling Station


Thursday 5th May - school site closed to all pupils.



This year, Her Majesty the Queen became the first British monarch to celebrate a Platinum Jubilee, following 70 years of service. An extended bank holiday from Thursday 2 June to Sunday 5 June 2022 will give communities throughout the United Kingdom the opportunity to commemorate the event.

Newham Council wants to help local people do just that so we have set up The Queen's Platinum Jubilee Community Fund to help support community celebrations. It will be a wonderful opportunity for communities to come together to celebrate Her Majesty's achievements and service, as well as enjoy each other's company.

The Queen's Platinum Jubilee Community Fund will open on 1 March and close on 31 March.

Residents and community groups are invited to organise commemorative or celebratory events for The Queen's Platinum Jubilee from Thursday 2 June to Sunday 5 June. Grant applications can be made up to a maximum of £500. Those receiving a grant will also receive a waiver of all non-statutory fees and charges such as road closures, hire of council community venues and parks.
