Our Learning

Quarter 3 - Learning Fair

Last Friday we held our latest Learning Fair, these are held at the end of every quarter to showcase the learning that has taken place. They give opportunities for children to:

- share their learning with others,
- refine their presentation and speaking skills,
- build self-confidence.
- promote school community cohesion and
- provide tasters of units that children will go on to study, or recap ones they have done in previous years.

Approximately 8 children remain in each class to host, whilst all other children visit other classes.

Children not only lead all these sessions but should also be involved in planning and preparing for them throughout the course of the unit. Please see below some examples of the learning and activities that were shared during this quarter's Learning Fair.











Science club biodiversity

On Monday the science club completed phase 1 of its biodiversity study of the school's flora and fauna. This involved the science club children looking around 2 key points of the school, the planting area and the field boundary. They made



notes of the various species found, using field guides to aid identification and

then estimated numbers present.

As part of phase 2 the science club will collate all this information, and will then discuss options as to how the biodiversity of the school could be increased.

Learning Tips



Reading - Encourage your child to read

Reading your child's wellbeing develops imagination and has educational benefits too. Just a few minutes a day can have a big impact on children of all ages. Remember it doesn't have to be a marathon just put aside 5-10 minutes a day to share a book

Handwriting

Much of handwriting is about correct letter formation and then muscle memory, which is why children's handwriting improves when they practice.



As this a focus for this term in years 1 to 6, please make sure your child completes and returns their handwriting homework.



E-Safety - Group Chats

Many of our children use group chats to connect with their friends and this can be a very positive experience. However they can also be the source of upset, bullying and harassment if they are abused.
