
We were delighted with the very positive Ofsted report following our inspection at the end of the summer term. The report states that we have continued to improve since our previous inspection, when we were judged GOOD and recommends a further inspection to see if we meet the criteria of OUTSTANDING. The report also gives recommendations for further development and this will form a key part of our planning for this year. Some excerpts are in this newsletter and the full report is available on the school website.

We presently have eleven governors representing parents, staff and members of our local community. We all meet with Mrs. Ferguson at least five times each year including a day spent in school reviewing progress over the past year and planning for the next. We also have subcommittees focusing on Curriculum and Standards and on School Finances. At our

meetings we receive reports about the main school and about Little Ellies and the Children's Centre. We also review school policies and the overall strategic development of the School.

Visiting the School

Each governor has a specific linked responsibility, for example English, the Arts or Inclusion. All Governors visit the school at least three times a year to learn more about

QUALITY OF EDUCATION

<u>In 2018-19 we wanted to:</u> Continue to raise standards in reading.

<u>Governing Body Statement:</u> We introduced a revised approach to the planning and teaching of reading last year so that we planned more specifically for gaps in children's reading understanding. Staff training accompanied this and we were pleased with the impact on the number of pupils reading at age expected levels (see previous page).

<u>In 2019-20 we want to:</u> Review our phonics provision to make sure there is consistency throughout the key stages and focus on development of higher order reading skills.


