Uniform & PE Days

Children in years 1 to 6 need to come to school in their PE kits on their PE days (unless it's school photos!). The days your child has PE are below, please note that children do get two sessions but some of them happen on the same day.

- ★ Year 1 Monday & Thursday
- ★ Year 2 Wednesday & Friday
- ★ Year 3 Tuesday
- ★ Year 5 Thursday & Friday
- ★ Year 6 Monday





Year 4 classes have swimming for 6 months and walk to and from the swimming baths. Therefore, for the 6 months they are doing this they do not have additional PE times.

- ★ Year 4 Octopus Swimming until February half term and so do not need to come in their PE kits for this period.
- ★ Year 4 Seahorse PE on Wednesday and Thursday until February half term

Children in Reception should bring their PE kit in on these days as they will change in school. This is part of their development in self care skills.

Breakfast & After School Clubs

Breakfast club is available every school morning for years 1 to 6. Reception children can join from after the first half term. Children enter through Mitchell Walk gate between 7.30 and 7.45 am. To apply for a place please use the link below.

Reading

Ask questions

To keep children interested in the story, ask your child questions as you read. Start with 'Where did we get to last time?', 'Can you

remember what's happened so far?' and 'What do you think will happen next?'.

Maths

Get children to tell you the time rather than you tell them! Try and make telling the time part of the things you do every day.



Well-being

Use activities that you do together to have conversations about how they are doing. Talking whilst doing something together, side-by-side, such as cooking, can help them share their feelings more easily than a face-to-face conversation.
