E- Safety

Sendit is an add-on to Snapchat, not a standalone app: it requires users to have an active Snapchat account, which they then connect to Sendit. It's important that trusted adults realise, therefore, that any risks associated with Snapchat also affect children using Sendit. Within the app, people play question games like



'Truth or Dare' and 'Never Have I Ever': users select a question to share on their Snapchat story for their friends to reply to. All responses are anonymous, although – for paying subscribers – Sendit reveals hints about who sent which messages.

<u>Newham Warm Haven</u>

Newham Warm Havens are safe, non-judgemental warm spaces where residents can go, free of charge. They are part of our response to the cost-of-living crisis.

On Monday our first Newham Warm Havens open in our libraries. All 10 of our libraries will be open for the longer hours of 10am-8pm Monday -Saturday during the coldest months of the year, October-March and on Sundays 12-4pm. Further Warm Havens will be announced shortly.
