Anti-bullying Week




This year's focus was **#ILoveMe**. The children were photographed with a sign saying what they were great at.

Eco-Guardians

You may be aware that we have been awarded the Green Flag award-with Distinction- for our work last year improving the school environment, and looking at ways the school can have less of an impact on the natural world. Our Green Flag finally arrived this week and will be displayed in school. The report on our application said they liked how we selected Eco-Guardians, and how 'the process has really helped them to improve their confidence, critical thinking and leadership skills.' They also



valued 'the educational approach' we took to the programme and how we communicated what we did through the newsletter and school website, display boards in school and through Eco Guardians feeding back to their classmates. They liked how we worked with Newham Council, Keep Britain Tidy and BikeAbility to expand the learning opportunities for our children and how we organised a litter pick to clean up part of our own playground. This year the Eco Guardians will be tackling three major items:

Years 1&2 will be working on our school garden

Years 3&4 will be looking at reducing the amount of food we waste at lunchtimes

Years 5&6 will be helping encourage more sustainable travel among staff and students
