Right now, humans aren't living sustainably: we're taking too many resources and not leaving the world in a fit state for future generations. Old tech products are a clear example: if we throw them away, the poisonous lead and mercury inside can get into the food chain through the soil. Recycling

tech, though, has its own issues: it's often exported to countries where the law doesn't protect people from hazards. Whole villages (including children) sort through discarded devices to remove useful parts and substances like gold, silver and copper – often putting their health at risk. Finding ways to reuse tech is the greenest option.

Lest We Forget

To mark Armistice Day a service will be held at East Ham Cenotaph in Central Park. This is a special service of Remembrance aimed at young people, with children from several Newham schools taking part.


