Next Tuesday (7th) we have our SMSC re-accreditation visit. This is an award that looks at the quality and impact of work to help children with their Social, Moral, Spiritual & Cultural education and personal development.

Living Streets are an organisation that promotes walking to school for health and environmental reasons. They are running a badge design competition and this year's theme aims to bring pupils closer to the nature found across Britain!

WHAT SHOULD YOU DRAW?

Wherever we live, nature is all around. Encourage pupils to go out for an adventure with their families to see what nature has to offer in the local area. Pupils can also draw a special memory of nature from a recent holiday around Britain or from a different season.

EXAMPLES OF DESIGNS COULD INCLUDE:

Animals or insects e.g., squirrel, foxes, stag beetles, dragon flies
Lakes, rivers, canals or coastlines e.g., River Thames, Royal Docks (with nature focus)
Vibrant flowers or mighty trees e.g., bluebells, English oak tree
Rolling hills or awe-inspiring views e.g. Beckton Alps, The Greenway, Beckton Park, or further afield.
Wherever your British Nature Walk takes you, draw it!

Be big, bold and colourful! Diversity and originality are key to standing out from the crowd! WOW badges are only 3cm, so simple designs without small details in them work best! Trademarks or logos must not be used, Winning designs will be digitally recreated, so pupils can use pencil, crayons or pens.

E- Safety

Twitter is a social media network which allows users to post short messages ('tweets') of up to 280 characters. Tweets can consist of text, photos, videos, audio, links, polls and GIFs – often linked by hashtags if they share a common theme or message. Hashtags receiving high levels of interest are said to be 'trending'. Twitter users can engage with other people's posts by liking,



retweeting (sharing) or tweeting back (commenting on). Since the entrepreneur Elon Musk acquired Twitter in 2022 for \$44 billion, the platform has undergone several major changes.

In the guide, you'll find tips on a number of potential risks such as trolls and bullying, fixation on view count and interaction with strangers.

Our tips for staying warm at home day and night are:

- If you can't heat all the rooms you use, it's important to heat your main room during the day and the bedroom just before going to sleep.
- Wearing several layers of thinner clothing will keep you warmer than one thick layer.
- Having hot food and drink is also effective at helping to keep you warm.



Newham Stay Safe App

Newham Stay Safe App enables reporting of street harassment incidents and safety concerns. The app features tools to upload



evidence in the form of photos, videos and audio. The App enables you to get access to specialist support, report incidents for investigation by the Police or Council anonymously and provides a direct route through to the 24/7 Stop Hate UK helpline.

The app is designed to give reassurance as well as a sense of safety and security whilst travelling out at night. It aims to empower women and girls and encourage reporting of any incidents where they feel unsafe in public spaces.

The app will help gather useful information which can be used to hold perpetrators to account and bring them to justice as well as target our resources to make our streets safer.
