## **Clubs**

## Save Money on your Broadband and Mobile Bills



Telecom giants BT, EE, Sky, Virgin Media O2, Vodafone and TalkTalk will all increase bills for tens of millions of customers from April 1 under price rise rates already baked into contracts.

If you are struggling to pay, ask your provider if they offer a discounted social tariff, which is typically priced at around £10 or £20 a month.

You must receive some form of welfare support, such as universal credit or pension credit, to be eligible.



## Reading

#### **Maths**

Rapid recall of basic number bonds (like 5+2= 7 and 7-5=2) and multiplication tables is essential in helping your child to progress. Although this is taught in school, practice is the key to help this become embedded.

#### Ideas to help

- Chant times tables and/or number bonds on your to and back from school.
- Use rhymes & games (youtube has some great ones)
- Use Maths in a Flash & Times tables Rockstars
- Play speed games to see if they can answer more quickly and beat their last time.


#### Water Only Schools Toolkit
