Learning Tips

Reading

Visit the local library together. It's always fun choosing new books to read, and keep an eye out for special events at the library or local bookshops particularly during the holidays.

Just remember to read a little every day!



Maths

Rapid recall of basic number bonds (like 5+2= 7 and 7-5=2) and multiplication tables is essential in helping your child to progress. Although this is taught in school, practice is the key to help this become embedded.

Ideas to help

- Chant times tables and/or number bonds on your to and back from school.
- Use rhymes & games (youtube has some great ones)
- Use Maths in a Flash & Times tables Rockstars
- Play speed games to see if they can answer more quickly and beat their last time.

The Help is Here booklet lists a range of resources that can provide information and support for people around finances, housing, energy bills, food, work, health and emotional wellbeing.


