Earthquake Relief Appeal



Impact of national strike action

As you know there are currently 3 further planned days of national strike action by members of the NEU. The strike is happening because of a national dispute between the unions and the government over the lack of school funding, teachers' pay, the current recruitment and retention crisis and the devastating impact this is having now and will continue to have in the future.

At this moment it appears likely that this industrial action will still take place on the following dates:

- Thursday 2nd March 2023
- Wednesday 15th March 2023
- Thursday 16th March 2023

We do not know definitely ahead of time which classes will be affected (last time it was every class). This becomes known when eligible staff do or do not present to work by 8.30 am on the affected day.

Therefore for Thursday 2nd March we will text the parents of any classes we can open by 8.40 am and you can bring children into school up until 9.30 am.

I am sorry about the potential disruption to you and to your child's education. I understand that this situation may be frustrating, and ask that all members of our school community continue to treat each other with respect. If you have any further questions please contact the main office and ask for a member of the Senior Leadership Team to contact you.

Little Ellies childcare is unaffected and so will be open on these days.

Message from the Governors Finance Committee

The Governors Finance Committee met on 2nd February. At this meeting we discussed maintenance and repairs, including repairs to Little Ellie's playground and toilets which should be completed during holiday periods this year. We also reviewed a number of policies relating to finance, school lettings, first aid and safeguarding.



The main agenda item was looking at the budget. In common with other schools, we have seen our expenditure rise significantly recently. Although the School has always been very careful to keep spending within our means, we now need to consider where extra savings can be made in the new financial year. We will update parents as soon as possible with further details.

Everyone can help children with maths – you don't need to be an expert, and there is help!


