# **General Information**

## **Governing Body Meeting**

Our first meeting for this academic year was held on 14th September and we were delighted to welcome back Mrs Ferguson, who is currently beginning a phased return to work.

The first meeting always includes some organisational decisions; electing chair and vice chair, agreeing committee memberships and appointing link governors for the year. We reviewed school policies covering grievance, discipline, sickness absence and appraisal. We also had a briefing on the latest safeguarding guidelines in the government policy document Keeping Children Safe in Education.

Mrs Owen-Amadasun presented her report on the start of term and were pleased to hear that planned repairs and building work had been completed over the holiday period.

Most families completed our survey during the parents evening in July and we are grateful for all your feedback. The results showed a very high level of satisfaction with the School. We will of course be looking at ways to continue improving this based on your feedback. You will be able to see the planned action and the full survey results in the governor newsletter which will be sent out later this term.

We also completed the Audit of Governor Effectiveness, in which we look at how well we meet our obligations as governors. It includes all aspects of our responsibilities and asks us to reflect on how well we keep ourselves informed about educational developments nationally as well as keeping up to date with School developments and understanding key issues at Ellen Wilkinson.

#### Free school meals in primary schools

Every primary school aged child attending school in Newham still has the opportunity to have a free school lunch even if their parents/carers are not in receipt of one of the qualifying benefits for free school meals.

Reasons to apply - discounted after school clubs and discounted trips

If your child is eligible for Free School Meals after school clubs and any residential trips are offered at a discounted rate.

Extra funding for your child's school too!

Whether your child is at primary school and receiving a free meal, has packed lunch or you are currently working, we request that the parents/carers of all primary and secondary aged children in Newham should still register for free school meals, even if you don't think you are currently eligible. Once we have the application, if at any time a family is in receipt of one of the qualifying benefits for free school meals we will automatically update our records and their school will receive additional funding known as Ever6 Pupil Premium. This is up to £1,320 depending on the child's age!

school open evenings are taking place. You can also find this information on our website in the parents tab/admissions or by using the link below.



# **Uniform & PE Days**

Children in years 1 to 6 need to come to school in their PE kits on their PE days (unless it's school photos!). The days your child has PE are below, please note that children do get two sessions but some of them happen on the same day.

★ MONDAY - Year 1, Year 5 & Year 3

★ TUESDAY - Reception, Year 2 and Year 4





Year 4 classes have swimming for 6 months and walk to and from the swimming baths. Therefore, for the 6 months they are doing this they do not have additional PE times.

- ★ Year 4 Octopus Swimming until February half term and so do not need to come in their PE kits for this period.
- ★ Year 4 Seahorse PE on Wednesday and Thursday until February half term

Children in Reception should bring their PE kit in on these days as they will change in school. This is part of their development in self care skills. Please also note PE Bags & Book Bags have still not gone live on the app as soon as they do you will be able to purchase on Parentmail.

# **Community, Wellbeing and Support**

### Parking - Dove Approach

We understand that the school pick up can be a rush for parents and parking close to the school can be difficult at times but we do ask that you be mindful of our school neighbours and avoid parking on the yellow lines on Dove Approach. There is parking further up Dove Approach and the joining roads.



Dear Parents/Carers.

This is a gentle reminder for all our parents to ensure their children are up – to date with their measles vaccinations (MMR vaccination: measles, mumps and rubella). If your child has not has not received the MMR vaccine we strongly advise you to contact your GP.

As you are probably aware there has been a recent increase of children contracting measles in London. Measles is a highly contagious viral infection that spreads through respiratory droplets when an infected person coughs or sneezes. It can cause severe complications in young children, pregnant women and individuals with weakened immune systems.
