






Dear Parents & Carers,

Teaching and Learning for this month



Our book of the month for October was the following:

Class 2 (babies and toddlers) and Class 3 (preschool) - **'Handa's Surprise**' by Eileen Browne.

This book is about a young girl, Handa, who wants to surprise her friend, Akeyo, with seven delicious fruits. The village she lives in is based in East Africa, Kenya. We felt that this book was perfect for this time of year as we have been celebrating different cultures and traditions such as Black History Month and Halloween. Reading this book to our children gave them an opportunity to widen their knowledge and experiences of diversity and inclusion.

Through this book we explored and learnt about different people in our community and the world around us. Children's vocabulary was further extended by learning and using descriptive language to express their thoughts and feelings. Children really enjoyed speaking about their families and home life. The book also gave us a chance to explore different types of foods and traditional clothing. Staff set out some creative activities for the children to take part in this month i.e. designing african necklaces, baking fruit salads and banana cakes and creating music with african drums. Our book of the month has allowed us to produce some beautiful work, which we always display around the nursery, captured in our observations and in the children's busy books. To help bring our book of the month to an end and to further stretch and challenge our children, we encourage parents to buy this book and to encourage children to try and taste the different fruits from this book to extend their palates, which will continue their learning. What other recipes can you make with the fruits?

Parents Evening & Evidence Me

From Monday 28th November to Friday 2nd December Little Ellies will be holding parents evening (face to face). Appointments will be available in the coming weeks so we invite you to book an appointment with your child's key person to discuss how your child has settled and is developing within the nursery. Furthermore, it is a meeting on how we will work alongside you to help your child meet their developmental goals. You will be able to look through your child's busy book, share any concerns or ask questions that you may have. Please make sure that you book a suitable time with your child's key worker. Meeting with your child's key worker is very important especially if you need to discuss anything about your child's development.

Parent tips: Toileting

Before we start potty training at nursery:

- Your child should be settled and familiar with their key person and the environment.
- You must start for 2 weeks at home. Once your child is using the toilet or potty we can start at nursery.
- Talk to the key person. Discuss with them before your child comes to nursery in pants/knickers. This then prepares the key person to support your child.

Provide a minimum of 3 sets of changes of clothes daily.

Please be aware that we encourage children to be independent. Children are encouraged as much as possible to clean themselves after toileting. Please encourage your child to wipe themselves and to wash hands after toileting. Be mindful that at nursery your child may have accidents and please remain calm if this happens. Children at 2 and 3 years are building their confidence and self-esteem. Even though your child may be dry at home they may be wet at nursery, children develop at different stages. This is not the fault of the child and is not because your child is not taken or asked if they want to go to the toilet. The nursery is a large environment with people, children, different areas and activities that they are familiarising with daily. Please note your child will get there and it is not a race. Together we will support your child to toilet train through building their confidence and self-esteem by praising and rewarding them.
