### Teaching and Learning for this month



#### Our books of the month for September were the following:

Baby Room - **'all about me'** by baby sparkle. This book is about children learning their body parts which fitted in nicely with the teaching and learning that has taken place in the toddler and preschool room.



Class 2 (toddlers) and Class 3 (preschool) - **'Owl Babies**' by Martin Waddell and Patrick Benson. We felt that this book was perfect for this time of year as we have many children settling in to Little Ellies and as Autumn is almost upon us. Reading this book to our children, helps them to support their learning around families. Through these books we explored the theme all about me — where children have learnt similarities and differences between themselves. Children's vocabulary was further extended by learning and using descriptive language to

#### express their thoughts and feelings.

Our book of the month has allowed us to produce some beautiful work, which we always display around the nursery, captured in our observations and in the children's busy books (which are available on request). To help bring our book of the month to an end and to further stretch and challenge our children, we encourage parents to buy this book and take your child to your local park to talk about the habit that owls live in which will continue

### **Book of the Month**

For the month of October our book of the month for all rooms (including babies) is Handa's Surprise by Eileen Browne. This book helps children to understand different cultures, how they live, what they do, which also helps with promoting British Values.



#### Events this month

As part of being a multicultural setting please see some of the festivals and cultures in October that we will be celebrating; Black History Month, Harvest Festival and Halloween.

We will be having a Witches and Monsters Party on Wednesday 25th October where we will be doing lots of learning around spooky stories. We are looking to host a whole day centred around language and storytelling. This will hopefully get our children excited to learn more about stories and characters, and inspire them to begin to tell their own stories. As part of our day we ask that you help the children to dress up in a spooky or a relatable costume for the day.

If your child will turn 4 before 31st August 2024 then you will need to apply for a school place for them by
